FIRE DEPARTMENT PRIVATE

GENERAL SUMMARY: As a team member, a Private may be assigned to either the Fire Force or Fire Headquarters. He/she shall observe and follow all department rules, regulations, policies and procedures. He/she shall be diligent in carrying out all assigned tasks to completion in a safe, efficient manner. He/she shall keep his immediate superior officer informed and up to date as necessary or instructed. At all times he/she shall display a positive image to the community and coworkers in dress and demeanor.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

1. Respond to routine and emergency incidents on appropriate fire department apparatus. Work in combating, extinguishing and preventing fires; in rendering emergency medical services; and in operating and maintenance of Fire Department equipment, apparatus and quarters.
2. Train and participate in duties of protecting life and property by firefighting and rescue activities.
3. Learn and participate in the operation of apparatus and the performance of extremely hazardous tasks under emergency conditions which may require strenuous exertion under such handicaps as some or confined surroundings.
4. Have a thorough knowledge of and follow the rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the fire department and other applicable standards, ordinances and state and federal laws that relate to the duty assignment. Requires initiative and a thorough individual understanding of firefighting, rescue and emergency medical methods.
5. Have a thorough knowledge and make use of the various resources and methods available to accomplish assigned tasks in a safe, efficient manner.
6. Have a thorough knowledge of the first alarm response district, and a familiar knowledge of the remaining fire station response districts, including but not limited to the various streets and roadways, addresses, unusual or high risk locations, properties and hazards, as provided through building tours or other means.
7. Be diligent in performing and completing scheduled and unscheduled tasks related to vehicle, apparatus, equipment, building and grounds inspections and maintenance.
8. Develop and maintain the necessary skills to drive and operate the several types of vehicles, apparatus and equipment used to safely and efficiently resolve routine and emergency situations.

9. Complete and maintain the security of all official department records and reports as directed and assigned.
10. Work well in a team environment under routine and emergency conditions.
11. Communicate effectively with team members, superior officers, the public and other persons, verbally and in writing.
12. Develop and maintain the computer skills necessary to perform assigned tasks.
13. Develop, maintain and display a team spirit that exemplifies the finest traditions of the fire service, consistent with the department's goal of providing the best possible services to the community.
14. Maintain the skills necessary to perform and complete assigned tasks and duties.
15. Strive to achieve and maintain economies and efficiencies of department resources, materials and utilities.
16. Provide fire prevention and public education duties.

OTHER FUNCTIONS:

1. Perform additional duties as assigned.
2. Maintain the security of department records, reports and other information received in the course of employment.

JOB REQUIREMENTS:

1. Possess and maintain a valid Rhode Island Driver license
2. Possess and maintain licenses (i.e. EMT-Advanced Cardiac or EMT-Paramedic) and certifications as required.
3. Meet applicable collective bargaining agreement language.
4. Maintain the physical and mental abilities necessary to perform incident scene and administrative tasks.

WORKING CONDITIONS:

Working as a member of a team or possibly alone:

1. Perform routine and emergency duties under normal or adverse conditions, including extreme heat and cold, indoors and outdoors, in an environment that could include above ground, below ground or limited space conditions.

3. Function in situations where extreme danger may be present that could result in injury or loss of life to you and to others.

He/she shall keep his/her immediate superior officer informed and up to date as necessary or instructed. At all times, he/she shall display a positive image to the community and coworkers in dress and demeanor. Essential Functions: respond to routine and emergency incidents on appropriate fire apparatus; work in combating, extinguishing and preventing fires; in rendering emergency medical services; and in operating and maintenance of fire apparatus inclusive of driving and pump operations; train and participate in duties of protecting life and property by firefighting and rescue activities; learn and participate in the operation of apparatus and the performance of extremely hazardous tasks under emergency conditions which many require strenuous exertion under such handicaps as some or confined surroundings; have a thorough knowledge of and follow the rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the fire department and other applicable standards, ordinances and state and federal laws that relate to the duty assignment; requires initiative and a thorough individual understanding of firefighting, rescue and emergency medical methods; have a thorough knowledge of the first alarm response district, and a familiar knowledge of the remaining fire station response districts, including but not limited to the various streets and roadways, addresses, unusual or high risk locations, properties and hazards, as provided through building tours or other means; be diligent in performing and completing scheduled and unscheduled tasks related to vehicle, apparatus, equipment, building and grounds inspections and maintenance; develop and maintain the necessary skills to drive and operate the several types of vehicles, apparatus and equipment used to safely and efficiently resolve routine and emergency situations; complete and maintain the security of all official department records and reports as directed and assigned; work well in a team environment under routine and emergency conditions; communicate effectively with team members, superior officers, the public and other persons, verbally and in writing; develop, maintain and display a team spirit that exemplifies the finest traditions of the fire service, consistent with the department's goal of providing the best possible services to the community; maintain the skills necessary to perform and complete assigned tasks and duties; strive to achieve and maintain economies and efficiencies of department resources, materials and utilities; provide fire prevention and public education duties. Environmental Conditions: fumes, chemicals, dust, odors – exposed to extremely toxic and hot gases, fumes and smoke; exposure to hazardous substances; exposure to extreme changes in temperature-high temperatures in enclosed spaces from fires; exposed to extremely poor ventilation conditions at fire scenes; exposed to loud and very loud noises from pumps, engines, trucks, sirens, and loud voices from Commanders and fellow Fire Fighters; exposed to fall hazards from climbing ladders or stairs; exposed to burn and smoke/gas inhalation hazards from working around fires and/or combustible materials; exposed to electric shock hazards especially if working around electrical lines; exposed to fast moving traffic at MVA scenes.
